

Urban Explorations

For this assignment you will explore one of Pittsburgh's 90 neighborhoods. Pick a neighborhood you have never been to, know little about, and is distinct from communities you frequent (e.g. distinct in racial demographics, socioeconomic status, geographic location, etc...). The information on CourseWeb can assist you in your selection. You should spend at least two hours in your chosen neighborhood. Bus, walk or drive around the streets to get a general feel for the community's residents, houses, public facilities, infrastructure and private establishments. Spend at least one hour of your time observing people and their interactions. You can make observations at parks, public libraries, coffee shops, places of worship, community meetings, museums, retail stores, laundry mats, grocery stores, community centers, etc...

Throughout your time in the neighborhood, take detail notes of the physical environment and social behavior. Note layout of streets and buildings, building materials, residents' body language as they walk or speak to one another, and your own emotions/body language/comfort. Recollect conversations you hear or have with residents. Take pictures of relevant objects or buildings (avoid taking pictures of people's faces unless you have direct permission).

In a 400-500 word assignment, you will write up your exploration, observations and impressions. Start by providing a descriptive picture of the neighborhood. Then discuss in what ways it did or did not meet your expectations. Use 3-5 specific observations, conversations, pictures (with captions), etc... to support your claims about the community. Conclude with any questions you now have about this neighborhood, Pittsburgh or cities more generally.
